Welcome to Autumn

Council's focus at the moment is well and truly the budget - preparing a draft budget to release to the community in April. Our next newsletter will capture a summary of the budget, key timelines, and how submissions can be made. With a 1.75% rate cap imposed by the State Government, reviewing community proposals already received, maintaining existing services and delivering capital works, the development of a balanced budget is not a simple or easy task.

The job of actively pursuing external grants remains critical in a rate capped environment, and in February we received an exciting funding boost with the Federal Government announcing two grants totalling approximately \$2.5 million towards the Rushworth to Murchison Rail Trail. This funding will see an 11 kilometre trail connect Rushworth to Murchison along the former rail reserve via Waranga Basin. The trail will provide a free, safe and accessible space for locals and visitors to enjoy and increases what's on offer across our shire. This project will be just one of the projects included in our Capital Works Program, a key component of the budget for the 2022/23 year.

We also welcomed \$230,000 from the State's Office of Youth from the Engage! and FFreeZA programs to support youth participation and engagement. Staff are actively working with our Youth Advisory Group to deliver initiatives from these grant programs, required to be spent across three years.

And for our community, two important Council grant programs are now open, Community Grants and Business Assistance Grants. Full details about each program and how to apply are on page 2.

As we move out of COVID restrictions, councillors and staff are once again out in the community, at events and meeting with community groups. Our "Out and About" feature is back in this newsletter, capturing a range of photos. If you are wanting councillors to join your group or event, email or write to us so we can include it in our diaries. We all look forward to meeting you and your group and continuing to learn more about our shire.

Apply Now!

Two of the most significant Council grant programs are now open for application. These grant programs only open for two rounds each year and are very popular. For full funding criteria or to apply for either of these grant programs, go to 'Now Open' on Council's website. Applications for both programs close at 4pm on Friday, 15 April.

Community Grants

This program offers financial support to not-for-profit community organisations, groups and associations for projects, exhibitions and/or performances that contribute to the municipality. Applications for this program have a maximum grant amount of \$4,000. Recent successful applicants of this program include:

- Kyabram Blue Light Inc – towards their health, fitness, and wellbeing centre at Kyabram P-12 College
- Tongala Cricket Club Inc – towards the TCC Mini Blues Program
- Girgarre Development Group Inc – towards a performing arts sound desk

Business Assistance Grants

Businesses can apply through this program to assist them to diversify and expand their business, or to encourage new businesses to start up. There are four funding categories, each with different maximum grant application amounts:

- Start up / new
 - Operating less than one year
 - 1 – 10 full time equivalent employees
 - Maximum grant of \$3,000
- Small business
 - 2 – 10 full time equivalent employees
 - Maximum grant application of \$5,000
- Medium business
 - 11 – 19 full time employees
 - Maximum grant application of \$10,000
- Large business
 - 20 plus full time employees
 - Maximum grant application of \$15,000

Delivery

Turning It Up a Gear

Keep An Eye on The Mailbox

To thank you all for 'Giving a Scrap' to your green bin, a random selection of 300 residents across the shire will receive vouchers in their mailbox.

These vouchers can be redeemed for two free bags of compost which can be collected from Council's Resource Recovery Centres.

These bags of compost are the children of the garden waste and food scraps you put in your green bin. By placing your green waste in the green bin, instead of sending it to

landfill, you help to create a nutritious soil additive. Compost increases the nutrients in the soil and aids in water retention.

If you receive a voucher and don't plan to use it, please consider gifting it to a family member, friend or neighbour who will! If you missed out on one of the vouchers, mulch for your garden can be collected free of charge from Echuca and Mount Scobie Resource Recovery Centres. Spreading mulch on top of

your garden is another fantastic way to increase water retention in your garden beds!

Become an Animal Foster Carer

Volunteering as an animal foster carer is a 'win-win' situation. We spoke to local animal foster carer Val McDonnell, to find out what the experience was like.

"As a senior, working minimal hours and now in retirement, I knew I wanted to volunteer in some capacity with the community. I love animals and had heard of the animal

shelter and its great work in looking after the animal's welfare. I learnt they were looking for foster carers for cats, kittens and dogs. After contacting them and going through the induction process, the little bundles of joy started to arrive!

Being a foster carer brings a lot of pleasure into my life. I have been a carer for three years and have fostered 30 kittens and four adult cats. They become part of the household for a time negotiated between the shelter and myself.

I have had a litter for one week and others up to 7 weeks. I can still enjoy what I want to do in my life without the time commitment and responsibility and demands of my own pet. I can still travel, visit children and maintain my lifestyle and yet experience the joy of having animals in my home.

I feel rewarded that I am helping the shelter in providing care, time and space and also looking forward in giving the foster animals every advantage to being adopted and loved. The whole process is seamless and there is no cost to me. Everything – such as food and toys are provided by the shelter, as is their support.

I would encourage anyone, whether in a family situation, with children or on their own, to think about enhancing their own lives and that of the foster animals by becoming a foster carer. It's a great thing to do!"

Animal Ownership

How do I register my animal?

Dogs and cats aged 12 weeks and older must be registered with Council until they pass away. Annual registrations are due by 10 April each year. Pet owners whose cats and dogs are already registered with Council should have received their registration renewal by now. If you have not received your renewal, you can contact Council and pay over the phone or through our website. Dogs and cats must be microchipped before Council can accept registration.

How many dogs and cats can I have?

You cannot have more than two dogs and two cats on any residential property unless you have a permit to keep more. Farm zone properties are permitted to keep five dogs and five cats.

How do I change my registration details?

- If you move house or change your telephone number, please complete a change of owner's details form.
- If the owner of the animal changes, please complete a change of ownership form.

- If you move to Campaspe Shire and your animal is registered in a different shire, please complete an animal registration application form.

The above forms are available on Council's website.

How much will the registration cost?

A full fee amounts to \$147. If your animal is desexed or aged over 10 years, you are qualified for a cheaper fee of \$49. If you are member of an applicable organisation (eg. Australian National Cats Inc, Dogs Victoria) you are also qualified for the cheaper fee of \$49. If you are the holder of a Pensioner Concession Card, you are qualified for a fee of \$24.50.

When does my animal have to wear its registration tag?

It is illegal to not have the registration tag on the animal's collar when it is away from the property it is registered to. Rangers can issue an on the spot fine if an animal is away from its property and not wearing its tag. If your animal is registered and the tag is destroyed or lost, you are entitled to another tag free of charge. You can collect a registration tag from any Council Customer Service Centre.
