Campaspe Times Newsletter July 2023

I'm delighted to announce that after much thoughtful debate, the 2023/24 budget was adopted at the June council meeting. The budget has dedicated \$27.4m to our capital works program, including \$10.2m on roads and bridges, bringing much needed improvement to the thousands of kilometres of roads we all drive on every day. \$6.5m has been allocated to new and replacement plant and equipment so that our wonderful works crews can get the job done of making our parks and gardens a great place for you all to visit. There is also \$4.3m being spent on public buildings which will ensure the public spaces our residents use are up to the standard they expect, as well as investing in a spread of community projects.

You can view a full copy of the adopted budget on Council's website.

During the first week of July, Campaspe celebrated NAIDOC week. The theme this year was 'For Our Elders' celebrating the important role and prominent place that Elders hold in our communities and families.

I attended a flag raising ceremony and morning tea at Njernda Aboriginal Corporation. It was great to see so many in attendance and hear stories of our Elders and how they have guided generations over the years.

The Foundry Arts Space also celebrated NAIDOC week with an exhibition created by students from St Joseph's College. They commemorated the NAIDOC week theme by creating portraits of their Elders and respected Indigenous community members. I hope you had the chance to see the wonderful work from the students at The Foundry Arts Space.

I had the opportunity to travel to Canberra last month with some of my fellow Councillors and our CEO Pauline Gordon. Talking to Federal Government Ministers is an important role we play ensuring



they understand the needs of our area as well as working to secure any funding opportunities that may be available. I also attended a dinner with other local government Mayors and CEOs, meeting Ministers and our Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese.

Last month Campaspe Shire Council signed a joint Memorandum of Understanding with Murray River Council to continue cross-border collaborations. This document cements the great working relationship that Campaspe Shire and Murray River Council have with each other as we work together to support service delivery to towns on both sides of the Murray River.



Seniors Support

Seniors Program Grants 2023

Campaspe Shire Council is committed to promoting positive ageing through increasing the health, wellbeing and social connectedness of the aged community. The Senior Program Grants is a way of achieving this.

The Seniors Program Grants provides funds of up to \$1,000 to deliver programs or activities.

We are looking to fund innovative projects that support positive ageing initiatives and activities that focus on social connection and wellness.

Examples could include:

- Resources to directly support existing senior programs or activities.
- Activities or events to welcome new senior participants or residents.
- Fun programs that seek to engage our Seniors.
- Support to make programs more inclusive of vulnerable community members. E.g. eg. Culturally and Linguistic Diverse, LGBTIQA+ communities.
- Providing support or training to develop new skills or talents.

Community Transport for Seniors



Council provides a Community
Transport Service, available to assist
frail older people and people with
disabilities who are unable to get to
medical appointments using public
transport or other transport options.
Trained volunteer drivers can take
you to your appointment using a
Council owned vehicle. As there is no
government funding for this service,
it is dependent on driver and vehicle
availability. It is available only to
eligible people and a fee is charged.

Our libraries also offer a "Books on Wheels" service where volunteers can deliver your library books if you are unable to get to the library. Contact Campaspe Libraries on 5481 2400 or email libraries@campaspe.vic.gov.au for more information.

Accessible parking permits

Accessible parking permits give parking concessions to those with impaired mobility. If you need an accessible parking permit, you can apply online, or request a hard copy of the form from us. You will then need to visit your GP or occupational therapist for them to complete an online assessment and submit your application. Council will review the application and if your application is successful, you'll receive your permit in the mail.

Project updates

Shire Wide Solar Project

Several Campaspe Shire community buildings will have solar power systems installed (inverter and panels) in the coming months. This will help the Committees of Management reduce the energy costs.

An analysis was completed of multiple buildings to assess power usage, structural integrity, roof size and orientation, with the following locations being included in the program:

- Echuca East Community Building
- Kyvalley Hall
- Kyabram Plaza Theatre
- Girgarre Memorial Hall and Supper Room
- Koyuga Hall
- Nanneella Memorial Hall
- Tongala Community Centre
- Lockington Community Centre
- Rochester Service Centre

Key points to note:

- Communication with the relevant user groups will be ongoing throughout the project.
- Design and construction contracts were recently awarded.
- Detailed designs showing the proposed solar systems have been received and reviewed by Council.
- Over the next couple of months, Council will focus on completing the following:
- Site investigations, structural verification and finalising designs for all nine buildings.
- Seek power authority approval for the designed works.
- Order all solar system materials and equipment and commence construction.

This project is expected to be completed by 30 September 2023.



Shire Wide Public Amenities Program

The contract has been awarded for replacement of three ageing public amenities across the shire. New fully accessible 'modular' amenities will be installed at Alton Reserve in Echuca, Rotary Park in Rochester and Lions Federation Park in Rushworth. Accessible parking and footpaths will also be installed at the Rochester and Rushworth sites, with accessible parking already available at the Echuca site. The modular design enables the amenities to be fabricated and assembled in the factory, and then craned into position on site, minimising the time that the amenities are out of action for the community. Each of the sites have alternative amenities a short walk away. Council will install signs during construction advising of these alternative locations. The new amenities are clad in Colorbond, with the colour specified to suit each location. These amenities will be completed by 31 October 2023.

Both programs of works have been funded by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure grant funding.

Immunisations Going Online

Immunisation is a simple, safe and effective way of protecting children and adults against certain diseases. Immunising yourself or your children is important for not only your health, but also for the health of your community because when enough people are immunised diseases no longer spread.

Council provides free childhood immunisation sessions in accessible community settings, adolescent programs in schools, and offers a range of vaccines for adults and business programs (fees may apply). Flood Recovery Update

Flood Inquiry Submissions

Thank you to all those in the community who took the time to lodge a submission to the Inquiry into the 2022 Flood Event in Victoria. While the statistical data speaks volumes about the devastating asset losses, it's only through the stories of local residents, businesses, farmers, teachers, community groups and others impacted by the flood that the human toll can be truly understood. Your experiences and insights will now inform the committee's recommendations to better protect our communities from such disasters into the future. At the time of writing. of the more than 750 submissions received to date, about half are from Rochester alone.

New Community Recovery Hubs

Since the October floods, residents and impacted people have been able to access support and resources from temporary community recovery hubs. With Victorian Government funding, Council has now set up the first fit-for-purpose community recovery hub at 48 Mackay Street, Rochester, including a mobile unit for outreach. The hub will be staffed five days a week by dedicated community recovery officers and a range of Council, government and professional support services will be delivered from the venue. Flood Advocacy

We are delighted that our latest funding applications to the state and federal governments have been successful. An amount of \$1.087 million has been awarded under Round One of the Disaster Ready Fund (DRF) for:

- review and updating of the Echuca Moama Torrumbarry Flood Study
- preparation of a Flood Risk Management Plan.
- purchase of demountable levee panels.

An amount of \$110,000 was also awarded under the Connecting Community to Builders Program. This will help flood-impacted residents to rebuild their homes by linking them to local trades in the area and assist Council to process the increase in planning and building permit applications.

Plastic Free July - UpCup!

Plastic Free July is a global social movement that aims to end plastic waste so that we can have cleaner streets, oceans, and beautiful communities. Once again, we are participating in this initiative.



Recent estimates show takeaway coffee cups lined with plastic, and their lids, are now one of the most used single-use plastic items in the country with recent research finding 1.84 billion single-use cups used each year. Most single-use coffee cups end up as landfill or as litter on our beautiful beaches and in our rivers and oceans. Once in the environment they break up into microplastics, which cause lasting harm to wildlife and marine ecosystems. One way to reduce plastic is by choosing to 'Up Cup' by ditching disposable coffee cups and bringing a reusable coffee cup to your favourite cafes. If you are not a coffee drinker, we encourage you to choose

another plastic item to give up. Check out www.plasticfreejuly.ord for inspiration.


