Stagnant Water

If you have concerns about the smell of black (stagnant) water or sewage leakage around your property, please contact the EPA (1300 372 842) or Coliban Water for assistance. **Never eat fish caught from the flood water.**

Managing waste after flood

Floodwater is often contaminated by sewage from overflowing sewerage or septic systems, and by agricultural or industrial wastes and chemicals.

Proper management of floodwater and waste can help to reduce risks. EPA Victoria provides help and resources to reduce your risk.




Register for sandbag removal
