## Waste

- Kerbside collections are continuing across the Shire on roads that are not flood affected.
- Resource Recovery Centres (transfer stations / tips) are open.
  - Rochester Transfer Station open 9am 5pm for household flood waste ONLY
  - Commercial operators can use the Rochester Emergency Transfer Station at 22 Malloy Street
  - Colbinabbin Transfer Station is closed, due to flooding of the access road
  - All remaining transfer stations are open with normal operating hours in place

## Mosquitoes

Mosquito activity has increased due to high levels of water and weather conditions. Key reminders for the community are:

- Wear long, loose fitting clothing, completely cover up
- Apply repellents containing picaridin or DEET
- Keep the kids safe. You can spray their clothes instead of their skin

# Flood water safety advice

Where possible, it is important for you and your pets to stay out of flood water

- Flood waters are dangerous and highly contaminated, and exposure is likely to cause yourself, and your animals, serious illness
- If you must enter the water, protect yourself with waterproof clothing and sturdy footwear to prevent injury
- Wearing disposable gloves is also advised
- If you come into contact with flood waters, wash yourself thoroughly with soap and clean water, and use hand sanitiser

# Water update - Coliban

#### **Echuca**

- The clear water tanks at the Echuca Water Treatment Plant (supplying drinking water) were shutdown Sunday for maintenance work.
- Post these works, you may notice your tap water is not as clear as usual.
- During these wet conditions, we recommend putting 20-40 litres of drinking water aside in suitable containers to meet the drinking water needs of your household.
- Flood gates have been installed
- Built a levee at the Water Treatment Plant
- Sink hole Anstruther Street has been temporarily filled
- Wet weather caused some sewer spills in the region.
   Where we can safely access these sites, we have commenced cleaning up

### **Rochester**

- The Water Treatment Plant (supplying drinking water) is still operational and protected by the flood gates.
- Toilets and showers are available to you at the following locations
  - The park in Queen St, Rochester
  - Corner of Pascoe and Baynes St, Rochester
- Your sewer network is partially operational. Whilst the network has been partially restored, the service will be unreliable and customers should expect outages.
- Finished sandbagging at our sewer pump stations to protect critical infrastructure

#### Gunbower

- If you are able to do so, we recommend putting 20-40 litres of drinking water aside in suitable containers to meet the drinking water needs of your household.
- Your water remains safe to drink
  - We have undertaken precautionary sandbagging of our critical infrastructure in the town
