Access and Inclusion Action Plan 2020 to 2022



Background

In 2019 Council adopted an Access and Inclusion Strategy 2020-2026. The focus of the strategy is to demonstrate Council's commitment to equal participation for all people across Campaspe and develop a road map to support the shire to become more accessible and supportive.

The most significant change was the adoption of nine Communities of Priority being:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders
- People with disability
- Youth
- LGBTIQ+
- People with mental illness
- Older people
- Women
- Culturally diverse groups
- People with social disadvantage

The document identifies four strategies to achieve the desired outcomes:

- 1. Plan and deliver Council services that enable access and inclusion
- 2. Ensure Council's decision-making process includes participation by and with consideration for Campaspe's Communities of Priority
- 3. Advocate for the needs of Council's identified Communities of Priority
- 4. Develop and maintain partnerships with groups that support the needs of Council's identified Communities of Priority

This action plan identifies what services, activities and projects Council will progress over the next two years. It is intended to be dynamic, and will be updated over the life of the strategy to ensure Council's response remains current.
